Airgun Major Hutchinson Memorial Competition

Conditions of the Shoot

Eligibility:-

Open to shooters who are affiliated to the NSRA either directly or through a club to which they belong at the time of entry.

NSRA competition rules and regulations apply unless otherwise stated.

Format:-

An individual competition, dependant on number of entries, shot in 3 classes, A, B and C. Competitors will be allocated to each class in accordance with their submitted average.

Equipment:-

0.177 air/gas pistol or rifle.

All airguns to conform to NSRA regulations. Multi-shot airguns must only fire one shot per one operation of the trigger and are to be brought to a stand/bench between each deliberate shot.

Targets:-

10m Pistol:- Air 4/89

10m Rifle:- Air 3/89

Course of fire:-

80 shots at 10m, with 5 shots per target - total of 16 targets. All shots including sighters, must be completed as two courses of 40 shots; each course must be completed within 1 hour 20mins.

Stickers will be numbered 1 to 8 for the first course of 40 and 9 to 16 for the second course of 40.

The courses must be fired on a club range in the presence of a club official, who will act as witness and ensure that the stickers are placed on the front of all targets before the beginning of the shoot.

There is no time limit between the two courses of fire and these courses may be shot on different days, provided that completed cards are received by the Official Scorer before the stipulated closing date.

Scoring:-

All shot competition targets must be returned to the Official Scorer - shots must not be gauged at the club.

Submitted averages:-

Shall be based on the best 5 of the last 6 of their most current SSBSA Individual League scores. Where this is not possible a club average may be submitted but an average will also be calculated on the first 3 cards. The higher average will be used in the "best handicap" at the end of the competition.

Juniors:-

A Junior class may be run providing there are sufficient number of entries. The age limit for juniors is 18 on the last date for entries. If there are insufficient juniors to form a junior class they will be placed in a respective adult class according to their averages - at no extra cost.

Awards:-

Only one award may be won. Winners in each class (including the junior class if run) will receive a perpetual engraved trophy and medal, medals will be awarded to the top 40 score and best handicap in each class.

Perpetual trophies must be returned to the organiser for engraving 2 months before the next awarding.
