



# SOMERSET SMALL BORE SHOOTING ASSOCIATION



## Air Gun – Summer and Winter League



### Conditions of the shoot

**Eligibility:** Open to shooters who are affiliated to the SSBSA either directly or through a club to which they belong at the time of entry. NSRA competition rules and regulations apply unless otherwise stated.

**Format:** An individual competition with competitors arranged into divisions according to their average. 10 rounds on competitors home range. Official scorers to mark cards and forward results.

**Equipment:** All league competitions: 0.177 air/gas pistol/rifle  
in addition 20 yd pistol : 0.22 calibre air/gas pistol may also be used.  
All airguns to conform to NSRA regulations. Multishot airguns must only fire one shot per one operation of the trigger and are brought to a stand/bench between each deliberate shot.

**Shooting Period:** **Summer:** May to September **Winter:** November to March

**Targets:** **10m Air Pistol:** Air 4/89 **10m Air Rifle:** Air 3/89  
**20 yard Pistol:** PL15 or PL15/09 You may also use PL14 or PL14/06 centres.

**Course of fire:** All divisions 20 shots per round.  
1. **10m** five (5) shots on 4 competition targets per round  
2. **20 yard** ten (10) shots on each of 2 competition targets per round

**Scoring:** Scorers are to have a NSRA scoring classification. Or return cards to organiser.  
Plug Gauges conforming to NSRA regulations; obtainable from the NSRA shop.  
**10m rifle targets** Air 3/89, use a 10m gauge spindle etched "A/R"  
**10m pistol targets** Air 4/89, use a 10m gauge spindle etched "AP10", (10MAP) .  
**20 yard targets** PL15 or PL15/09, alternatives PL14 or PL14/06 centres, the plug gauge spindle etched "PL14" must be used, whether shot holes are 0.177 or 0.22 calibre.  
Gauge reference see The Rifleman Spring/Summer 2011 - For scoring the PL14 contact organiser.

**Submitted averages:** Based on the best 8 of the last 10 of their most current SSBSA Individual League scores. Where this is not possible a club average may be submitted but an average will also be calculated on the first 3 rounds. The higher average will be used in the "most improved average" at the end of the competition and may also involve a divisional move.

**Divisions:** Divisions will consist of 6 to 10 shooters dependant on number of entries.  
**Points awarded:** points will be awarded at the end of each round - max points (for the highest score) to 1 (lowest score). Equal scores will attract equal points. Zero will be awarded for no cards returned.  
Max points will equal the number of competitors in the division. ie 6 shooters - max points will be 6.

**Juniors:** The age limit for juniors is 18 on the last date of entry. If there are insufficient juniors to form a separate junior division they will be placed in adult divisions according to their averages. At no extra cost.

**Awards:** Each division, medals to the first, second and third place on points.  
Most improved newcomer and most improved Junior will be calculated using Macrae formulae.  
'Most improved' will use averages across both air Pistol at 10m, 20yds and air Rifle at 10m.

The **Somerset resident** with the **highest aggregate** will be known as:

10m: **Somerset Air Pistol/Rifle Summer/Winter Champion**

The Winter League champion will be awarded a Silver Medal, a Replica if won before.

20 yard: **Somerset Long Range Air Pistol Summer/Winter Champion.**

Perpetual Trophies should be returned to the organiser for engraving 2 months before the next awarding.
